

In 2008, Dynavin began based on an idea to offer drivers an OEM-look multimedia radio system not only with significantly better features than the original system, but also with the same optical performance. Dynavin continuously works to improve its products allowing Dynavin head units to be offered to over 30 models and currently have the largest technical standard on the market.

We have paid special attention to your personal safety during the development of Dynavin products combined with maximum ease of use, modern design, and the latest technology possible. However, please be aware if installed, used, or handled improperly, injury and/or damage may occur. Please read this instruction manual completely and carefully and keep it with you!

First Steps

If you have connected the device as indicated, turn on the ignition of the vehicle. The Dynavin will then boot-up. This may take about 30 seconds the first time. It will begin on the radio screen.




Radio Screen



Operating the Touchscreen

Most functions of the Dynavin device are controlled through the touchscreen. Therefore, to ensure the most accurate possible control, it is recommended that you calibrate the screen.


To calibrate the screen, you will see the icons below. Be sure to perform each function as indicated.



As on a smartphone, you can swipe to move left or right. To do this, touch the screen and slide the surface to the left or right.



System Settings



Region




Set your desired device language in the region setting. You have a choice of up to 10 languages. It is possible that in one of the selected languages the meaning is unclear or the text is too long.

Color



Select a color to change the color of the lines and icon borders on the screen.

Multi-Function Button



You can program this button to create a shortcut to a preferred function or mode. (Options are pictured.) Once programmed, simply press the button to instantly access it.

Brightness

You have several ways to adjust the brightness and control. This includes the dimming function.

First, touch the down arrow key right of the menu item labeled Auto / Manual.



After touching the arrow, there will be a sub-menu.



Depending on the selected function, another option in the settings may be unlocked.

Auto = Automatic dimming function

Illumination = on when lights are turned on

Sensor = light detection in the interior of the vehicle


Manual = Manually adjust the back light

The sub-menu will close automatically once you have completed a selection. If changed, a new button will be displayed.

For Manual mode, on the right of Manual, there will be a slider.



Then press on the slider to set the setting lever for the dimming function.




Through a Side-motion you can adjust the slider to the desired value.

Time Zone

In this menu, you can set the time zone in which you are located. This is set by Coordinated Universal Time (UTC).

Reverse

If your vehicle has an ORIGINAL PDC system installed or has an original rear-view camera, you can re-enable these depending on vehicle type.



This is NOT compatible on all vehicle models. Please refer to the compatibility information from Dynavin.

None: When no system is installed


PDC: If only one PDC system is installed


CAM : If only a rear-view camera is installed

PDC+CAM: When both systems (PDC and rear-view camera) are installed in the vehicle

With **None** selected, the screen will remain in the current menu when the vehicle is put in reverse.

With **PDC** selected, a new image will appear when in reverse.







Depending on the vehicle and vehicle system it is also possible that the front PDC information is displayed.

Please note that this system has only a supporting role. Faulty measurements caused by improperly built-in systems or by environmental effects causing interference can not be compensated by the system. These systems do not replace driver control or responsibility. Be aware of minimum clearances.


With **CAM** selected, the rear view camera image will be shown. Click setting icon to adjust guide line for better experience by dragging the snow bucket. **Please note that track line is not for all Dynavin units, it is for specific car type**.







Please note that proper image transmission is affected by camera settings, the installation of the camera angle, and/or external interference. These systems do not replace driver control or responsibility. Be aware of minimum clearances.

With **PDC** + **CAM** selected, both images will be displayed in one screen.




If you get a call while you are using the PDC system of your car, the call will be displayed as a 2nd window in the screen corner.





For more functions move the menu bar to the bottom by sliding the scroll bar or tapping the up and down arrows on the right side of the screen.

Brake




In the system settings you can change some of the basic options and settings of the device. Through a brief touch of the box next to the words, the option will be enabled.

A checkmark \checkmark indicates that the option is selected.

With **Brake** deselected, video playback or DAB-T will be inhibited so that you are not distracted while driving.

When you engage the handbrake, the image below will be displayed informing you that video playback is not allowed while traveling.



If you want to activate the video while traveling, select the Brake option.

Video Input



You can adjust the brightness and contrast of all external video devices.

Dual Zone

If enabled, video can be shown on external monitors in the passenger area while navigation is shown on the Dynavin screen.

Factory Setting

You can reset unit to the default settings.

Main Menu

The main menu displays icons for various features/modes across three pages or sections. You can move the windows using a swiping motion left or right.



Touch the screen with a finger and then move it to the right or to the left. This moves you to the individual pages of the main menu. You can do this in almost every menu.

The three lines on the lower side of the display show you which page is open and to which direction you can move. You can also touch one of the lines to go to that page.







Touch one of the icons on the screen with a finger to open the selected menu. This is only possible if the selected device is connected or the function has been enabled.

The marked symbols on the first image have a special function. These can be replaced according to your preference.

Moving Icons

To move a function icon on the Main Menu, read the instructions below.



You have the option to change one icon on the first page to icons from the last (third) menu page.

In the left picture, note the highlighted interchangeable icon.

Go through a scrolling movement to the third menu page.

Touch and hold to the function you want to move with a finger.



After about two seconds, the icon for the selected function is moved and you will automatically be on the first menu page. Continue holding your finger on the screen.



Place the icon you have selected over the icon you wish to replace.

Now take your finger off the screen. The icons will be exchanged automatically.





Radio Function






To access the radio function, select the radio icon in the Main Menu or press the physical radio button on the front panel of the unit.



Setup Radio Options





Tap the box next to AF to enable the option.

A checkmark \checkmark indicates that the option is selected.

High-cut = Reduce radio noise

AF = Alternative frequency

When selected, **AF** will display on the top of the radio menu. This allows a receiver to transform a different frequency providing the same station when the first signal becomes too weak.

Automatic

With this additional function of AF, you can select whether the AF function of the station you are listening is to be exchanged for another (Automatic) or that the station is to be maintained and only a new stable frequency is to be searched.

TA = Traffic Announcement

If this option is enabled, traffic messages can be recorded in the current program automatically.

Radio Text

If you have activated this function, information can be transmitted by the radio station to your radio. For example, information about played song or information about the current program as well as the station name.

Phantom Antenna Power

When radio signal is weak, you can select Phantom Antenna Power to power the radio antenna.

TMC Frequency adjust

Here you can set whether always the strongest stations in the region to be selected for the TA function, or the station you hear in the moment.



CD/DVD Function

To access the CD / DVD feature, insert a disk into the drive. Press the physical button labeled DISC on the front panel of the unit or the Disc icon from the main menu via the touchscreen.

After you insert the disc the playback of the music or video will start automatically.

To eject the CD / DVD, press the physical button on the front panel:

If you do not want to eject the media, but want to return to the previous menu, briefly press the **SRC** button on the front panel of the unit.





To access the Phone function, tap the Phone icon on the Main Menu. You can also press the Phone button on the front panel (not available on all models) or push and release the right knob.


In order to use the Phone function, you must first connect your phone to your Dynavin unit.

To do so, enable the BT option on your phone and search for nearby devices. Once your phone has finished the search, you should see Dynavin-N7Pro. Pair the phone with the device. (If your phone does not find the Dynavin-N7Pro, restart your phone.)

Once your phone is connected to the Dynavin unit, the menu below will be displayed.

Disconnect, in the upper left corner signifies that the phone is not connected to the unit.





When the connection is established, the name of the phone will be displayed at the top left. On the top right, you will see your phone's battery level and signal strength.

On the bottom of the screen you will see icons for Favorites, Contacts, etc.

Once your phone has been paired to the Dynavin, your phone will automatically connect every time if you have the BT option switched on and the phone is within range.

To access the Phone function, select the Phone icon in the Main Menu or press the physical radio button on the front panel of the unit (if available).

C Delete input

Each time you press the button, the last digit is the deleted entered numbers



All entries from the contacts on your phone are displayed.





When you select the phonebook option, it will take you directly to the search mode.



By briefly pressing the function keys, you can select the following.



: Select the keyboard language

(You have the option between Cyrillic, Greek, Latin)



: Delete the last entry

: Switch between numeric / special characters and letters

: Show and hide the keyboard

Touching one of the letters or symbols of the on-screen virtual keyboard will initiate a search function and will be presented on the top line.

Here you can search by name or phone number. The selection of the contacts found will be shown immediately.

If you select a contact, it will be displayed in a new window.



If you connect a different phone with the Dynavin unit, the in-memory contacts will be overwritten.

It is only possible to connect one phone to the unit at a time.

To view your phonebook, you must enable sharing of contacts, phonebook, etc. at time of pairing.



iPod® Function

To access the iPod® function, tap the iPod® icon on the Main Menu or press the physical button on the front panel labeled iPOD® (if available).

You can only enter this menu if you have connected an iPod® to the unit via USB.

Use only USB to iPod® cables by Apple®. Use of non-Apple® cables may result in malfunction or your iPod® will be unable to connect to the unit.

After pressing the iPod button, the home screen will open and display the contents of the iPod®. The iPod® will begin charging automatically. Depending on the size and amount of data, this can take a few seconds.



After the iPod® has finished loading, the playback interface will appear on the screen.

You can run almost all the options just as you would from your iPod® screen.



Functions of the iPOD® Menu





With a short press on the buttons you can select the following.

: iPod® option menu

: Repeat

Press once - The song is played once (OFF)

Press twice - The song is repeated until pressed again

The symbol for repeat is displayed in the upper line of the screen when selected.







If you want to browse the contents of the folder, use the search function in the menu. By pressing the keyboard icon, the virtual keyboard input option will be shown. Type the first letter of a title to browse the contents.

Song Menu



If you select the Song menu, you will see all songs (with titles) that are stored like the picture above.



Short press on the title of a song to play it.

An icon to the left side of the song title will show you what song is currently playing.



With an up and down motion, you can browse the songs in the displayed section.



If you want to browse the contents of the folder, use the search function in the menu. By pressing the keyboard icon, the virtual keyboard input option will be shown. Type the first letter of a title to browse the contents.



Playlist Menu



If you have opened the playlist menu, you will see all of them like the picture above.



A short press on the playlist name will open it and all the songs stored in that album will be displayed.



With an up and down motion, you can browse the songs, artists, or albums in the displayed section.



If you want to browse the contents of the folder, use the search function in the menu. By pressing the keyboard icon, the virtual keyboard input option will be shown. Type the first letter of a title to browse the contents.



To access the USB function, tap the USB icon on the Main Menu or push the physical button on the front panel of the Dynavin that is labeled USB (if available).

You can only access the USB menu when you have a USB device connected to the Dynavin via USB.

Use only USB media formatted with FAT16/32 otherwise the Dynavin may be unable to read the media. The connected USB media should not exceed 64 GB.

After pressing the USB button, the USB menu will load the contents of the device. Depending on the size and amount of data, this can take a few seconds.



If you want to use a hard disk, please pay attention to the necessary operating power. Some hard drives use more power than is supplied by the Dynavin unit; therefore, you may have to use an external power source.

Copying Files to Internal memory

Navigation

To use the Navigation, the navigation software micro SD Card must be inserted in the NAV slot on the front of the navigation system.

Almost any Windows-based navigation is compatible; however, the Dynavin will include the iGO-Primo Navigation software. Simply insert it into the NAV slot and select the Navigation icon from the Main Menu or press the NAV button on the front panel of the Dynavin. If you want to use your own software or the included software from Dynavin cannot be run, check the navigation software path settings below.



Navigation Start-Up

Go to the Main Menu, click the icon for Navigation or select NAV on the front panel of the Dynavin. You will see the navigation loading screen as pictured below.



When you start the navigation for the first time, it may take several minutes to complete.

Also, you must first set some options of the Navigation software like Language, Time, and Voice.

For all the functions and options of the navigation software, please refer to the manual for the navigation software.

The Navigation Software will be included by Dynavin but is not a permanent part of the device. The navigation software SD card must be inserted all at times for it to function.





Sound Settings

The Dynavin N7 offers a wide range of adjustable sound settings.

This includes the ability to set the delay times on the seating position and the ability to activate an original active sound system such as a BMW with a DSP system.

Please refer to www.dynavin.com for vehicle sound system compatibility and functionality.







On the Main Menu, select the Audio icon. Select a setting with a short press.

For some setting options, you will be taken to a new menu to set more options.



Fader - Balance - Delay

In the menu for Fader, Balance, and Delay you can set up the speakers so that they are leveled perfectly to your seating position.





Through a brief touch of the arrow icons, you can adjust the specified area.



With a long press on one of the settings, the setting will continue to change automatically.

Use the directional pad displayed on the right side to control the volume of individual speakers.

The arrows indicate the direction in which you move the center.

One press on the circle in the middle of the directional pad will center the selected setting.

The displayed crosshair on the vehicle indicates where the acoustic center is located.

With the speakers shown at each corner of the vehicle, you can set the duration. Once there, you can set the approximate distance in cm on how far your ear is located away from the speaker.

This can greatly enhance your music experience.


With the No-Delay button you can reset the settings.



Bass - Middle - Treble

In this menu, you can adjust the highs, mids, and lows of your sound system.

You can adjust Bass, Middle, Treble, and Subwoofer (if connected) by simply moving the indicators up and down.



Equalizer




Source



Other settings

If you select this option you can hear warning signals through the speakers. The warning beep includes seat belt reminders and so on.

Loud : This option turns up the bass and treble to make

OE DSP AMP : This option is only for cars with an original DSP amplifier, if the car

has a DSP system, you can select it to adjust DSP output.







The information displayed depends upon the make, model, year of the vehicle as well as its software version. Therefore, the information displayed varies from vehicle to vehicle. The Dynavin has limited ability to read car information. Vehicle information details cannot be given or guaranteed before the installation of the unit.

If some information is not displayed in the system, it is possible that the Dynavin unit cannot read this information with the current firmware. You may need to update to the current firmware. (See page 74 for instructions on how to update your Dynavin's firmware.)

The information displayed does not replace the vehicle's information.

If warnings from the vehicle's own monitoring stations take place, immediately seek a specialist workshop even if the information of the Dynavin unit may be displayed normally.



Time synchronization (except MC2000)

This function may only be used in Mercedes vehicles except for the MC2000.

Dynavin offers you the opportunity to remove the original Mercedes navigation unit to match the time of the on-board clock with the Dynavin.

This is only compatible if you have connected the unit through a supported car.





To activate, go to the Main Menu and select the Clock Sync icon with a short press.

The clock in the cluster display will then be synchronized with the time on the Dynavin unit.



In the Main Menu, select the Info icon. Here you will find some of the Dynavin's system information and the ability to update its firmware.



Here you can see, for example, the version of the DynOS operating system, serial number, and how much internal memory you available.

Before Installing:

You only need to update the firmware if your Dynavin is not functioning normally or if you are explicitly instructed on Dynavin's homepage or by a Dynavin distributor to do so.

Each update will be installed at your own risk. Dynavin is not responsibility for errors which may occur during the update resulting in the malfunctioning of the unit. Please ensure that during a firmware install that you have constant power to the unit and there is no power failure or other voltage fluctuations. This may interfere with the update process and make the device unusable.

Use only media cards which are 100% failure free. If you use a defective memory card it is possible that the update will not be able to install or that the update will damage your unit.

Use only firmware updates for your Dynavin that are approved by Dynavin and are found on Dynavin's website. Visit **www.dynavin.com** for available updates and to determine whether your Dynavin requires an update.

On the Dynavin homepage, follow the instructions for downloading the firmware.

Download the available update firmware for your Dynavin onto an SD Card. (The card must be formatted with the FAT 16/31 file system.)

You must extract the files and place them individually in the root directory (not in a folder).

Insert the card into the MMC SD card slot. (Depending on your Dynavin, you may need a micro SD card or a standard SD card.)

Click the Upgrade Now button:




If there is no update software on the card or you did not first extract the files, you will get a note as pictured below.



Only when the system finds the correct files on the card will the process continued.

Once the system update software is detected, the small light in the top left corner of the Upgrade Now button will turn green. Once the button is pressed, the Dynavin will begin downloading the firmware (do not remove the SD card). Once it has finished downloading, the unit will restart and install the update automatically. It is possible that you will see a black screen for a brief time.

The whole process will take about 3-5 minutes.
